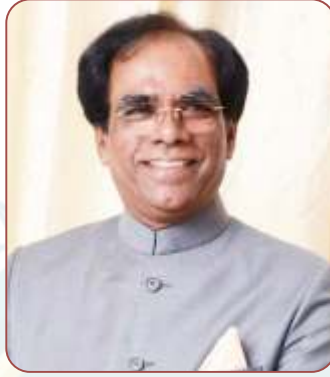

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

INTRODUCTION

The Department of Commerce started functioning on 7th August 2014, with two courses namely B.Com and BMS with 150 students. SANJU BHAGAT

Sanju Bhagat, a farmer from India lived his whole life with a bulging stomach.

Villagers teased him that he looked nine months pregnant. Little did they know that what they said was almost true?

In June 1999 when Sanju was 36 years old the growing stomach made it difficult for him to breathe.

He immediately rushed to the Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai in India for emergency surgery.

Doctors assumed that a tumor was growing inside, but on operating the doctor saw something he had never seen before.

One unnamed doctor described what she saw that day in the operating room:

"[The surgeon] just put his hand inside and he said there are a lot of bones inside," she said. "First, one limb came out, then another limb came out.

Then some part of genitalia, then some hair, some limbs, jaws, limbs, hair."

It actually felt as if Sanju had given birth. Doctors found that Sanju Bhagat had one of the world's most bizarre medical conditions- fetus in fetu.

Actually, Bhagat was carrying the mutated body of his twin brother for 36 years who had fully grown limbs, hair, and long fingernails.

It is an extremely rare abnormality, which occurs when a fetus gets trapped inside its twin.

The trapped fetus can survive as a parasite even past birth by forming an umbilical cord-like structure that leaches its twin's blood supply until it grows so large that it starts to harm the host, at which point doctors usually intervene.

Most of the time both twins die before birth because of the strain of sharing the placenta.

But in Bhagat's case, he survived the birth and amazingly supported the life of the leached fetus for 36 years.

No one suspected the problem. Everyone just thought he had a big stomach because he showed no discomfort.

Right after the surgery, Bhagat's pain and inability to breathe disappeared and he recovered immediately.

His weight reduced from 91kg to 40kg. The case may have

been a medical miracle to doctors, but to Bhagat, his condition had been a source of shame and misery.

All his life the people around teased him for his big stomach and taunted that he might be pregnant. Ironically what they said was true.

Today, Bhagat is in good health and leads a normal life, but he still gets teased occasionally.

People still laugh at him and say that he was operated and he had a baby.

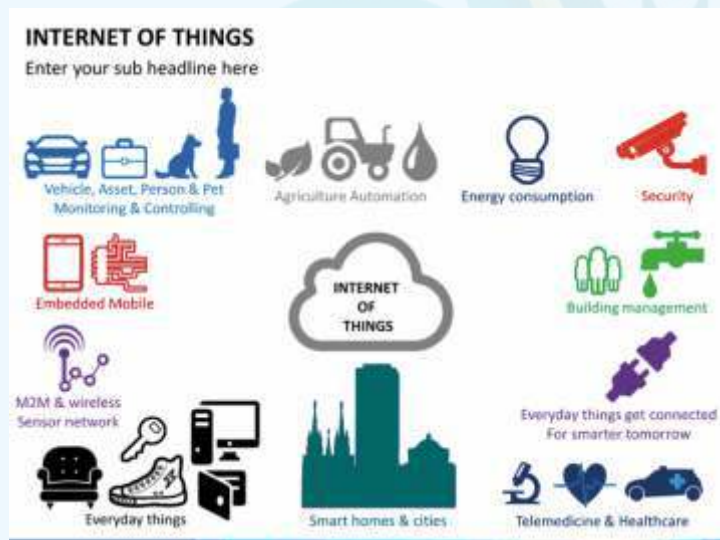

Internet of things (IOT) is simply a network of physical objects. The internet is not only a network of computers, but it has evolved into a network of device of all type and sizes, vehicles, smart phones, home appliances, toys, cameras, medical instruments and industrial systems, animals, people, buildings, where all of them are connected for communication & sharing information.

Imagine a world where billions of objects can sense, communicate and share information, all interconnected over public or private networks. These interconnected objects have data regularly collected through sensors, these data are then analyzed and used to initiate action through actuators, providing a wealth of intelligence for planning making use of AI-Artificial Intelligence, management and decision making without human intervention. This is the world of the Internet of Things (IOT).



IOT has applications across all industries and markets. It spans user groups from those who want to reduce energy use in their home to large organizations who want to streamline their operations. It proves not just useful, but nearly critical in many industries as technology advances and we move towards the advanced automation imagined in the distant future.

Some Applications of IOT :-

- **Smart Home & Smart Cities** - Building automation for

a home is called a smart home or smart house. A home automation system will control lighting, climate, entertainment systems, and appliances. It may also include home security such as access control and alarm systems. Smart city is another powerful application of IOT. Smart surveillance, automated transportation, smarter energy management systems, smart water distribution, urban security and environmental monitoring all are examples of IoT applications for smart cities.

- **Telemedicine & Healthcare** - IOT is ushering in the future of telemedicine. From real-time health monitoring to preventive care to empowering our elders to receive better care at home, the future of IOT-powered telemedicine holds promise.
- **Energy Consumption** - Smart grid concept is becoming very popular all over the world. The basic idea behind the smart grids is to collect data in an automated fashion and analyze the behaviour of electricity consumers and suppliers for improving efficiency as well as economics of electricity use.
- **Agriculture Automation** - In IOT-based Smart Farming, a system is built for monitoring the crop field with the help of sensors (light, humidity, temperature, soil moisture, etc.) and automating the irrigation system. Farmers are using these data to yield better return on investment.
- **Wearables** - Wearable devices are installed with sensors and software which collect data and information about users. This data is later pre-processed to extract essential insights about user. These devices broadly cover fitness, health and entertainment requirements.

The future of IOT is more fascinating than this where billions of things will be talking to each other and human intervention will become least. IOT will bring macro shift in the way we live and work.

LET'S UNDERSTAND GOOGLE SEARCH....

Now a days everyone is using Google for searching information. Thanks to the internet, information is easily accessible. But we don't know how this information is retrieved, we enter a small word and get everything related to it i.e. everything on single click. Is it a Miracle???? NO. Information Retrieval System is behind this miracle. Now what is this Information Retrieval?

Information retrieval is about making existing knowledge accessible. Information retrieval is the science of searching for information in a document, searching for documents themselves, and also searching for the metadata that describes data, and for databases of texts, images or sounds.

When we access information, it has been retrieved from online sources, which is where search engines come into picture. Gathering information-more precisely, information recovery is a discipline in computer science and information science and, above all, of great importance for search engines. Everyone uses Google search every day for a variety of reasons. Students use it for school, business people use it for research and million more use it for entertainment. But most people may not be using Google search to its full potential.

If you want to use Google search more efficiently and get the search results quickly, you can follow the tips given below. :

- **Use Tabs:** On the top of every search are a number of tabs. Usually you'll see Web, Image, News and More. Using these tabs, you can help define what kind of search you need to do.
- **Use Quotes:** When searching for something specific, try using quotes to minimize the guesswork for Google search. When you put your search parameters in quotes, it tells the search engine to search for the whole phrase. .
- **Use hyphen to exclude words:** Sometimes you may find yourself searching for a word with an ambiguous meaning. An example is Jaguar. When you Google search for Jaguar, you may get results for both the car and the Animal. If you want to cut one out, use the hyphen to tell e engine to ignore of the content with one of the other. For ex : Jaguar-cars, this tells the search engine to search for Jaguar but to remove any results that have the word"car" in it.



- **Find sites that are similar to other sites:** If you want to find other websites like one you are using, You would do this as:related:amazon.com
If you search the above, you won't find a link to Amazon.
Instead, you'll find links to similar websites.
- **Use~:** for Searching Similar words. For Ex: ~Mobile phone will result with words like: phone, cell, cellular, wireless, etc.
- **Use.....:** for searching Numerical ranges: For ex: 1994...1999
- **Use of OR:** for Searching the webpages that include either word. For ex: vacation Shimla OR manali will result in vacation with Shimla or Manali.

In our modern information society, Data and knowledge have a much higher priority than they were half a century ago. Thanks to the internet, information is more and more accessible.

Using complex information retrieval systems, they recognize the intentions that are behind specific search terms and find relevant data on search queries.
